15.Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

The institution offers Bachelor's degree programmes in Science including B.Sc. Biotechnology (Self-financed) - and Arts as well as Master's degree programme in Chemistry following the syllabus prescribed by Goa University. Multi disciplinary Course (MC) which facilitates students from Arts to opt for MC paper in Science and vice versa will be offered by the college. Multidisciplinary Course of 03 credits will be offered for FYBA/B.Sc. students which will be of interdisciplinary nature from the academic year 2023-2024. The institution will be offering Value Added Courses of interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary nature to both B.A and B.Sc students designed 11 faculty members from the as per the guidelines of NEP 2020. science stream and 04 faculty members from the Arts stream being members of the Board of studies in their respective subjects were actively involved in drafting and framing of syllabus for FYBA/B.Sc. syllabus that was to be implemented from the academic

year 2023- 2024. In addition 04 faculty members were also invited as special invitee in framing the syllabus under NEP 2020. The syllabus for Major, Minor and Value Added Course (VAC) was framed by the different Board of studies in their respective subjects. The Department of Philosophy and the Department of Economics were hosts to organize state level workshops in drafting syllabus under NEP 2020 during the academic year.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

The institutional preparedness in implementation of Academic Bank of Credit is dependent on the guidelines by Goa University and Directorate of Higher Education, Government of Goa, which is in A notification was sent by DHE to enroll all students process. for digilocker and create an ABC ID. UGC-NAD/ABC Bureau has developed and approved 04 videos regarding Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) programs and these have been posted on the college website for students reference. All students were intimated through Email to create their ABC ID in view of implementation of NEP 2020. Necessary steps and assistance was provided by the college office to students to create ABC ID and required data was sent to DHE in a timely manner whenever was asked for. Since the College is affiliated to Goa University, flexibility with regard to multiple entries and exits are in process in line with NEP: 2020 guidelines.

17.Skill development:

Under NEP 2020 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) will be offered at the first and second year of the undergraduate programme. The different courses under SEC in different subjects were finalized by BoSs and approved by the Goa University. These courses have one credit for theory and 2 credits for practical components. The college has a Skill Development Cell which offers courses of multi-disciplinary nature. The syllabi of four courses have been certified by Goa University. During the academic year 2022-2023, 11 Skill Development courses were conducted in accordance with the objective of NEP 2020. The institution undertakes skill development through hands-on workshops, seminars, interactive sessions and Personality Enhancement Programmes (PEP). The Institution's Innovation Council has organized workshops by inviting industry experts on ideation, prototyping and entrepreneurship. Internship is facilitated for students in industries and media houses. The College has a Research and Development Cell. The Cell informs faculty members about researchrelated workshops, submission of proposals for major/minor projects to funding bodies etc. in a timely manner. IQAC

facilitates faculty participation in Faculty Development and Enrichment Programs.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

The Institution has a Department of Indian Languages. B.A programme also offers Graduation in Konkani Honors and General Degree with Marathi and Hindi under the aegis of CBCS. Various courses have integrated Indian knowledge system such as the rich sahitya in Indian literature and culture, Indian Philosophy, Indic studies, Indian ways of good life, discourses on Indian political and social thinkers namely Kautilya, Sri Aurobindo and Swami Vivekananda. Science departments conduct exhibitions, workshops, talks, etc. to promote the natural heritage of India. BSc students are offered one course in the Indian language. As part of the Directorate of Higher Education project, faculty members have started developing e-content for bilingual curriculum transactions in regional language Konkani. Faculty members work towards increasing awareness and preserving the rich historical and cultural heritage through trails, walks, lectures, and cultural programs in the form of festivals. Yoga day and commemoration of national days and birth/ death anniversaries of noted personalities in the field of science, technology, sports and global harmony is undertaken to uphold India's contribution to humanitarian development. Talks highlighting ecological practices in festivals were organized to transfer knowledge about sustainability-values embedded in native Indian ways of life, to the younger generation.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The institution is affiliated to Goa University and the curriculum of all the programmes and courses are designed by the University with the help of Boards of Studies. The faculty members have contributed to the design of curriculum as members of Boards of Studies and also as special invitees. The institution has adopted Outcome-based education (OBE) to align the curriculum with defined learning outcomes. The process begins with faculty members collaborating to set clear, measurable learning outcomes for each course and program. Faculty members designed COs for courses in B.Sc. and B.A. programs. Subsequently, these were integrated into the syllabus designed by the Boards of Studies at Goa University. Faculty members have also framed course outcomes (COs) for the curricula of skill development courses. The curriculum is then mapped to these outcomes to pinpoint where and how each is addressed across the

courses. Changes may include the redesign of assessments to more effectively measure desired competencies, the introduction of new teaching methods like project-based or experiential learning, and the addition of interdisciplinary study opportunities. Efforts to integrate outcome-based education (OBE) into teaching and learning practices at the institution involve an approach, focusing on enhancing institutional strategies, assessment methods, and student support mechanisms to align with desired learning outcomes. Some of the initiatives are:Adopting learnercentered pedagogies, Incorporating real-world applications, Utilizing technology-enhanced learning, Student support services and Aligning assessments with outcomes. The institution has adopted: 1.Continuous feedback for improvement: Regular feedback mechanisms from students as stakeholders and faculty enable ongoing monitoring and improvement in the courses being offered. 2. Integrating technology: Plans are in place to utilize educational technology and platforms to improve the delivery and effectiveness of outcome based education.

20.Distance education/online education:

The Institution has a Wi-Fi facility to conduct online sessions. Google Meet platform was used to conduct webinars. Google Classroom has been used as a Learning Management System to facilitate remote learning. Faculty members integrate interactive e-tools in online teaching E-content (video recordings of modules) in English as well as regional language Konkani under DISHTAVO project is available to students for self paced and distance learning. The college has an in-house IGNOU centre to impart distance education..

Green Chemistry, Water Quality Assessment, Environmental Biotechnology, Plant Biodiversity, History of Ecology and Environment, Environmental Pollution and its Control Measures are incorporated in the B.Sc. and M.Sc. curriculum. The Bachelor of Arts program through its subjects, viz, Philosophy, Psychology, Economics, Political Science, History, English and the Indian Languages, ensures that students receive education that addresses cross-cutting issues. The curriculum nurtures ethical awareness, human values, women rights, social responsibility, and environmental consciousness among students, preparing them to be responsible professionals.

In the Third Year, research projects on topics related to gender, environment sustainability, carbon footprint calculations and human values are undertaken by the students. Awareness about plagiarism and ethical research is created among students.

Faculty members use blended learning methods, revolutionizing traditional teaching methods by integrating digital tools and online resources into classroom instruction. Teachers use powerpoint presentations and online videos, elearning platforms like Mindmap, Trello, and Quizlet to aid conceptual understanding. Faculty members use diverse tools such as SlideShare, Chemsketch, ChemDraw and Milanotes to enrich learning experiences, fostering deeper comprehension and application of knowledge.

Students are motivated to responsibly utilize online resources to expand their domain knowledge, accessing customized e-content and audio lectures tailored for enhanced retention and application. Teachers use Google classroom platform for conducting webinars, sharing the learning materials, and videos. Two ISAs per semester, per course are conducted following the Goa University guidelines. Guidelines of the Goa university ordinances regarding the assessment criteria and standards are communicated to students and faculty members via email and notices.

During the induction programme at the entry level, details about the examinations are conveyed to the students by the examination committee convenor. Students are provided with information about how assessments will be conducted, including the weightage for

different assessments and the grading scale used by the respective subject departments. Institutional exam committee provides clarification about the assessment process to the queries of the students.

Institutional exam committee shares the ISA timetable with students in advance for them to prepare well for the exam. In addition to ISAs, teachers conduct class tests, quiz, presentations, etc. Assessed question papers and assignments are shown to the students and feedback is provided.

Providing regular and constructive feedback to students allows them to understand their strengths and areas for improvement. Institution ensures that assessments are conducted in a fair and just manner. HODs and ISA committees monitor and prevent over or under marking.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, timebound and efficient

The College Grievance Committee, established as per Goa University Ordinance, handles all examination-related grievances. If the students are dissatisfied with their result, they have the option to personally verify their answer book. If a student is still dissatisfied after the personal verification, then, the student can approach the College Grievance Committee within a week. The committee then seeks a response from the concerned faculty regarding any allegations made by the aggrieved student.

After considering the faculty's reply, the committee provides written recommendations to the principal. These recommendations may include a reassessment of the answer book by another teacher from a different college. Further, if the allegations of the student are deemed genuine, the committee records the reasons and takes suitable action against the faculty, as per ordinance OA-5.2.6 of Goa University. Besides, the Head of Department resolves the grievance that is in the department's purview. The Institution ensures the redressal of the grievances of students if any, in a time-bound manner.

3.4 - Extension Activities

3.4.1 - Extension activities are carried out in the neighborhood community, sensitizing students to social issues, for their holistic development, and impact thereof during the year

Social responsibility is paramount for the Institution. The National Service Scheme (NSS) and National Cadet Corps (NCC) are the key student units for extension and outreach. Through these units, 14 cleanliness drives and awareness campaigns around water bodies such as rivers and beaches were carried out by 86 NCC Cadets and 239 NSS volunteers under programmes such as Swacch Bharat, Puneet Sagar Abhiyaan and Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav.

The institution also prioritizes health, both physical and mental, thereby contributing to social welfare. Students actively participate in blood donation camps conducted in the institution and also beyond. Under the guidance of faculty mentors, they undertake awareness sessions on lifestyle and mental health in educational institutions. Street plays on suicide prevention and public rallies against human trafficking are used as alternate means to create awareness among the masses.

75 students have volunteered for Purple Fest, a week-long event celebrating inclusivity and diversity organised by Goa State Commission for Persons with Disabilities.

The Institution adheres to the fundamental duty of generating a scientific temperament among school students by organizing the annual Science Exhibition. Students also create awareness on the importance of education and gender equity as part of community service through street theater.

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

The College is well equipped with facilities and resources to cater to the teaching and learning. The classrooms and laboratories are spacious and are equipped with updated technologies.

26 classrooms are Wi-Fi and ICT enabled which foster a culture of learning and innovations.

The laboratories in various science departments and Psychology laboratory are well equipped with high end instruments and tools to conduct practicals of undergraduate and post graduate programmes.

The institution has a seminar hall, audio-visual/recording room, which is utilized to organize workshops, seminars, conferences and screening documentaries for students under aegis of educational clubs. The language laboratory with state-of-the art infrastructure is equipped with computers with updated software that enables students to upgrade their language skills.

The Geology department has a museum with a wide collection of rocks, minerals and fossils. The library has a reading room and is partially automated with ILMS software KOHA, Version 21.11.01.000, extensive collection of textbooks, reference books, magazines, e-journals accessible through INFLIBNET and N-List.

The College has a botanical garden, a green house and a biogas unit for experiential learning. IGNOU center is also housed in the institution to cater to academic needs of diverse citizens.

The Institution was established in 1962, with campus area of 2.760661 acres, with a built-up area of 6657.29 sq mts. It has adequate facilities for sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga and cultural activities and all have 100 percent usage.

The Physical Education department provides coaching and training for outdoor games such as football, volleyball, cricket, kabaddi, badminton, basketball and indoor games such as chess, carrom, table tennis, weight lifting, power lifting and best physique. These facilities help students to develop their sporting skills and talents. Gymkhana is equipped with an internet facility which provides online access to sport techniques. The Institution also houses a volleyball, basketball and badminton court. Yoga and Meditation sessions are organized in the College quadrangle, and seminar hall respectively.

The cultural committee organizes many cultural programs. The seminar hall serves as a venue for hosting activities for students. It is equipped with WiFi connection, video conferencing facilities, collar and cordless microphones and podium. The students activity committee manages various competitions, with teachers offering guidance and training to participate in inter collegiate events.

4.2 - Library as a Learning Resource

The college library has an extensive collection of 37,666 books. During the academic year 2022-2023, 506 new books were added to the collection. The library also offers a range of services that include daily circulation of books, access to e-journals, ebooks through Inflibnet, N-List membership, syllabus for all subjects, including current and old ones. In addition, the library provides access to old question papers, internet browsing facilities, newspaper section, reading room and journal section.

The library reading room is equipped with 05 computers for browsing and 03 computers are kept as stack computers. These are for online reading and educational purposes.

In 2019, the institute installed KOHA 21.11.01.000 Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) to make the library partially automatic. This package of library service has several functions such as speedy book circulation, search engines, book tags, ID card and Bar Code generation support, flexibility with circulation policy and annual stock verification. By means of this software all books are barcoded to reduce the transaction time for book issue and return.

The Institution emphasizes on research, and has increased the research output using the strategic plan.

The Research and Development Cell was set up to cater to the research output of the college faculty. The Cell motivates the faculty to undertake Research projects as well as Paper Publications. The Management provides Cash incentive of Rs 25000-/- for publishing papers in SCOPUS indexed journals. List of research funding agencies are provided to the staff for obtaining research projects.

The institution is part of the Research Cluster of Science Colleges in Goa, and has a research center, which has enabled the students/faculty to register for PhD. in Chemistry. The Research Laboratory has high-end equipment for advanced research.

Organizational Structure:

In Accordance with statutes of Goa University, Governing Body has been constituted in the College. The Chairman, with nine members, makes all major policy decisions for the College. A Local Managing Committee is constituted of 11 members including 02 faculty representatives, the Principal, the Chairman and others. The Governing Body and the LMC has a secretary, designated as the Administrator, who serves as a facilitator between management bodies, the IQAC, the Principal and Viceprincipal.
