**"Report on the Workshop on " Applied First Aid" held on 7th February , 2025
Under DBT Star College Scheme**

Objective: The talk on "Applied First Aid" was organized to educate students and faculty on essential first aid techniques and their practical applications in emergency situations. The session aimed to provide hands-on training in handling injuries, performing CPR, managing fractures, and responding to medical emergencies like choking, burns, seizures, and heart attacks. The objective was to equip attendees with basic first aid skills that could help in saving lives and providing immediate care before professional medical assistance arrives.

Report: The Department of Zoology at Dhempe College of Arts and Science conducted the talk on 7th February 2025, with Dr. Brendan Peroz, Lab Head at Pathkind Labs Pvt. Ltd, Goa, as the resource person. The session was attended by 47 students from FY, SY, and TY BSc, along with 11 faculty members. Dr. Peroz began by explaining the importance of first aid in daily life and emergency situations, followed by detailed demonstrations of various first aid techniques. The event was highly interactive, with students and faculty members actively participating in hands-on demonstrations under his guidance. Techniques such as CPR, wound dressing, fracture management, and emergency response procedures were showcased, making the session both informative and practical.
